

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AI for Mental Health Monitoring

The presence of AI in mental health is not new. From the 1960s onwards, ELIZA became a popular AI chatbot, with Rogerian Psychotherapy perspective, created by Joseph Weizenbaum (Anyoha, 2017). Later 20th century saw the actual expansion of computerized based Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy (CBT) programs, with interaction-based software for therapy.

Currently, there is a broad list of AI tools that is used for chatbot-based therapy and mental health tools, which analyses data based on real-time to keep a track of the current patient mental health status. These chatbots provide a discreet and stigma-free platform for individuals to seek mental health support (Omarov, 2023). AI is used for early detection of mental health disorders, by analyzing speech, facial expressions and text (Lee et al, 2021). Facebook (now Meta) uses AI for mental health monitoring by screening suicidal and self-harm related content posted by individuals, and moderating those content and providing them support resources like links to mental health centers and organizations. Moreover, one of most revolutionizing trends is the use of wearable smart watches, which help in collecting and analyzing individual's sleep patterns, social interactions, eating habits and physical activities (Koutsouleris et al, 2022).

With future innovation and technology, AI tools can be effectively used in mental health sector for better pre-diagnosis for mental health conditions, exclusively designed to eliminate the risk of developing a mental health condition. AI can also remodel the mental health care by analyzing insights and provide solutions to complex mental health problems, through tailor-made therapies for clients, reduce stigma and provide better treatment outcomes. With better use of AI, mental health field will undergo a rigorous revolution, with easy and available access to mental health services.

Topic: 1st National Trial Advocacy Competition with AI at the centre

On March 08, 09 and 23, 2025, the Centre for Cyber Laws and Artificial Intelligence (CCAI), **Kirit P. Mehta School of Law, Mumbai**, organized its 1st National Trial Advocacy Competition to enhance advocacy skills, legal reasoning, and courtroom etiquette through realistic trial simulations. The highlight of this **competition was the proposition which was specially drafted for the competition keeping Artificial Intelligence in mind.** The competition had elements of AI imbibed in the proposition which was thoroughly discussed and debated during the entire competition. **51 students from across law colleges in India participated, arguing both prosecution and defence sides.** It provided invaluable experience in strategic litigation and professional courtroom conduct while keeping at the centre all nitty-gritties of Artificial Intelligence. Around 40 judges and advocates presided over the event.

By integrating AI for coding (ChatGPT), real-time deployment (Vercel), and hyperparameter tuning, teams accelerated development, turning prototypes into production-ready solutions in hours. 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Latest Updates and Trends

- **The AI-generated film *What's Next?***, created entirely using tools like Runway and Discord, premiered at the **75th Berlin International Film Festival**. While the film attracted attention for its innovative use of AI in filmmaking, **it also raised significant concerns** regarding copyright, authorship, and the **legitimacy of AI-generated art**. **Read more at: [The AI-generated movie *What's Next* opens new questions on AI filmmaking | Polygon](#)**.
- At its recent developer conference, **Baidu** announced a strategic pivot from **traditional text-based AI models to multimodal models** capable of processing text, audio, images, and video. The company unveiled two new models—Ernie 4.5 Turbo and X1 Turbo—and introduced **AI avatars for livestreaming** and an AI agent app named **Xinxiang**. - A **survey conducted by Cambridge University's** student newspaper **Varsity** revealed that many **Gen Z students are hesitant to use ChatGPT**, not due to academic dishonesty concerns, but because of ethical considerations. - **OpenAI** is preparing to launch its first **open-source language model** since GPT-2, focusing on **advanced reasoning capabilities**.
